

PHOTOGRAPHY PITCH POINT

The Photo Arts Conservatory at NYFA has two and three year degree programs (BFA, MFA) as well as One and TwoYear conservatory programs as well as 4 and 8 Week programs.

In the BFA and MFA students write research papers in their second to last semester, exploring an idea of their choosing, supporting it with research and citations. This paper helps them think through the ideas they will explore in their thesis projects.

The capstone project in the One and Two Year programs are exhibited here on campus, while the final thesis projects in the BFA and MFA are installed and shown at a local gallery.

The 1 Yr curriculum is an intensive prescribed set of courses aimed at getting you up to speed quickly. In the BFA and MFA programs students also have intensive technical foundational classes, after which students are able to choose their own classes in lighting, imaging, printing, business, art practice, theory and history.

We publish an annual photography magazine called FYAN (NYFA rearranged) that is student led, faculty facilitated. This class is only open to BFA and MFA students, but 1 Year students can submit their work for review to be published. FAYN is printed in a variety of formats and available to read on our website.

All photography instructors bring real world industry experience and academic credentials to the classroom. Most are working in commercial/advertising, editorial, documentary or fine art fields. Some have their work in permanent collections at LACMA, the Getty Research institute and various hotels and private collections, show at Art Basel annually and other galleries and art shows. All of your faculty are working professionals in their fields. They are here to teach and guide you through your academic endeavors.

The Photography program's intensive curriculum helps you, the student, discover your unique creative style and voice while providing a solid grounding in the technical skills that are necessary in the industry.

NYFA LA students shoot on the Universal Studios backlot as well as well known locations throughout Los Angeles, including: Venice Beach, Santa Monica, Downtown L.A., Joshua Tree and various other desert landscapes. NY students work all over with the city as a backdrop, as well as taking day trips to various locations around NYC.

The Tools

When students enroll in the long-term programs, they receive a digital camera with a 50 mm lens. Students have access to the latest image capture and post production software including: Adobe Creative Cloud: Lightroom, Photoshop, InDesign, Premiere Pro, After Effects, Capture One.

Each long-term program has courses in the business of photography. Students learn about marketing, planning, contracts, and the entrepreneurial strategies they need to produce and deliver jobs on time and on budget to their clients. Students also understand how to get their work seen by specific targeted markets.

Industry Preparedness

For the One- and Two-Year Programs, students leave with a portfolio, live website and group exhibition.

All degree students leave with a professional portfolio in their area of interest, various marketing collateral (social media, website, postcards, leave behinds, book, etc.) and show work in a final group exhibition.

All BFA and MFA degree students have the opportunity to participate in internships after they complete 50% of their course load.

Post Graduation

NYFA LA'S Chair of Industry Outreach, Barbara Weintraub, works with each student before they graduate to create a professional resume and a postschool career game plan

Students are encouraged to keep in contact with Barbara Weintraub & NYFA after graduating, for industry opportunities. NYFA also has an Alumni Network website where they can collaborate and connect with fellow NYFA students in all departments, respond to gig postings and other opportunities.

NYFA Expeditions

All NYFA LA Photography students are eligible to be included in one expedition during the last third of their course of study. Past expeditions have been to Florence, Belize, Hawaii, Arizona and Bali. These trips are optional and each student pays his or her own way. Every attempt is made to make the cost affordable.

MFA Program

MFA student portfolios must be approved by the Dept. Chair in order to qualify. Students with an undergrad degree in photography, or professional experience, is usually required; otherwise, students may need to begin in the 1Yr. Program.

Focusing on the transformative power of photography to affect desire and change, much of her work questions how we can shift our focus away from the current racist, capitalist model of domination to one of equity and collective voice, for the sake of all people, animals and the Planet.

White is the Winner of PDN's Objects of Desire award, has attended several artist residencies, and exhibited throughout North America and Europe, including Scope, Art Basel Miami, and Photo LA. Recent group exhibitions include Natura-lism, Presenza UK, FOCUS Photo LA, Barker Hangar, Santa Monica, CA, and Center for Creative Photography's, The Qualities of LIGHT, University of Arizona.

Her work has been published in PDN, The Brooklyn Rail, The Village Voice, and Uncertain States. White holds an MFA in Photography and Related Media from SVA in New York, a Post Baccalaureate in Photography from the San Francisco Art institute, and a BA in English Literature from San Francisco State.

Jon Henry

Jon Henry is a visual artist working with photography and text, from Queens NY (resides in Brooklyn). His work reflects on family, socio-political issues, grief, trauma and healing within the African American community. His work has been published both nationally and internationally and exhibited in numerous galleries including Aperture Foundation, Smack Mellon, and BRIC among others. He was recently named one of the TIME Magazine NEXT100 for 2021. Included in the Inaugural 2021 Silver List. He recently was awarded the Arnold Newman Grant for New Directions in Photographic Portraiture, an En Foco Fellow for 2020, one of LensCulture's Emerging Artists for 2019 and has also won the Film Photo Prize for Continuing Film Project sponsored by Kodak.

Amanda Rowan

Amanda Rowan graduated Cum Laude from **Tisch School of the Arts** at NYU with a degree in Photography and Filmmaking. She has worked in NYC and LA as a portrait photographer shooting for corporate clients, international artists and pop celebrities. In 2014, Rowan published, Born Backstage, a photography book that documents the creative children of folk and rock legends of the 1960's and 1970's. Rowan has received numerous accolades for her art, including "The Curator Award 2019", by Photo District News (P.D.N.), "Photographer of the Year 2018" by the International Chromatic Photography Publication, and the Tokyo International Award for Photography in 2019. Her work has been exhibited internationally at the Carrie Able Gallery, Photo LA, Art Basel, The Wall Street Gallery, The Leica Gallery in Los Angeles. Her images hang in the permanent collection at The Palms Hotel in Las Vegas with Damien Hirst, Jean-Michel Basquiat, Andy Warhol, and Takashi Murakami.
